Record of the Interview with Ms Haley Akmed

Interviewee and position: Ms Haley Akmed, Head of ICT at XXX International School

Date of the Interview: May 4, 2009

What problem(s) does do you face in your position as Head of ICT?

The school rules are seriously out-of-date and have not been updated in two years. They are also written in formal language and are not very student-friendly. What I mean is that students do not really understand the rules as they are written or the consequences if they break the rules.

Do you know of any examples of students breaking the rules that had serious consequences?

Yes, recently a grade 8 student brought a memory stick to school with a sniffing program on it. He downloaded the software from the internet and was "curious" if it would capture other students' and teachers' password access to the school server. Fortunately, one of the librarians discovered the student trying to install the program on one of the computers in the library. We also have a serious problem with students copying information and photos from the Internet and not citing sources. These kinds of incidents have made me aware that we have to review and update our school rules.

How could an IT solution solve the problem?

Grade 8 is an important age where students do not realize that there are "evils" on the internet or they are trying out hacking software. I would like to create a grade 8 project where all of the students have to collaboratively research "digital citizenship" and present their findings. The students could then create new school rules in "kid-speak" so that all of the students would understand them.

The grade 8 students could work in teams to collect and analyze the information that they find and create new school rules. The students could also work in teams to create the school rules and related PowerPoint Presentations that would be shown at student assemblies.

Do you have any ideas?

I have an idea how this could be organized, but actually do not have time to setup the website. It is important that the students can post their information from home and also in school. Using the school server or email would not work. We have tried this in the past, so we have to use another solution that allows collaboration. Ms Marlene Davis, one of the history teachers, has used Wikispaces for a collaborative project with her students. It seemed to work very well.
