Notes for Criterion E: Product Development

As this is only a brief summary of the techniques used, marked documentation has not been produced for this criterion.

The following only outlines the complex techniques and other techniques that were used in the creating/editing of the video. This is only an outline of the techniques that would be developed in Criterion E.

Complex techniques used:

- complex editing (i.e. editing the interview of the students so that the responses for each question would demonstrated the various accents between all of the persons interviewed).
- timing of the music to correspond exactly to the length and action in the videos
- adjusting the sound levels of the music within the sound track so that the music plays throughout the clip, but does not interfere with the voice
- editing the video to include different camera angles, lighting and perspective to best capture the various topics included the video.

A complex task that should have been included in the video is the use of chapters so that the teachers could easily find a specific topic.

Other techniques used:

- titles including the names of all persons interviewed, credits citing the sources of the music
- transitions between clips to indicate the change in action.
