








Recreating the links to the buttons in OpenOffice

In many cases it has been noted that functionality of the buttons on some of the forms has been lost when the database is copied from one location to another.

To recreate the link between the button and the macro the following steps need to be taken:

Description of step	Illustration of step
<p>Open form to edit</p> <p>In this case it is the form called Car_repairs</p>	
<p>Choose object in form to edit</p> <p>In this case the 'close form' button has been chosen.</p> <p>Click on Control...</p> <p>Clicking on this will allow the properties of the button to be edited.</p>	
<p>Check that event is linked to a button click.</p> <p>In this case there is no event linked to the button, so the button will not function as intended.</p> <p>The When initiating information will need to be amended to recreate the link.</p>	

Recreating the link

Description of step	Illustration of step
<p>Locate the macro to close the form</p> <p>This macro is called Module 3 and can be located as follows:</p> <p>Click on the When initiating icon and a dialogue box will appear.</p>	
<p>Click on the assign macro button to bring up the macro selector dialogue box</p>	
<p>Locate the macro called Module 3.</p> <p>Single click on Module 3 and then on the OK button to return to the assign action dialogue box</p>	
<p>Click OK at the bottom of the dialogue box. The macro has been attached</p>	

Description of step	Illustration of step
<p>The macro is also shown on the Properties dialogue box</p>	
<p>Save the form</p> <p>Click on the save icon to save the form.</p> <p>The save icon will then go gray</p>
